We held our Parent Forum this week, and I would like to thank all who attended. It was a valuable and constructive conversation. We have prioritised more opportunities to meet with parents this year, as well as a more communication through these regular newsletters.

As ever, the last few weeks have been busy in the college, and this regular communication is one opportunity to update you on our progress.

This term, we have continued working as a college on our teaching and learning priorities. On the INSET day last week, staff worked collaboratively with colleagues across Fareham and Gosport to further develop subject knowledge and pedagogy in their different disciplines.
