Inspectors commented on our inclusive ethos, the calm and purposeful atmosphere around the college, our curriculum development and work on attendance, and recognised the significant improvement we have made since the last inspection.

I would like to recognise how well our students presented themselves during the inspection, in classes and in meetings or when talking to inspectors. We are very proud of them. I would also like to thank parents and carers for your ongoing support. Your feedback to inspectors was overwhelmingly positive, and there has been a significant rise in the number of families who say they would recommend the college. ## **Ordinarily Available Provision and SEN support**

Hampshire's Local Area Partnership has developed some guidance for parents and carers about our local offer around Ordinarily Available Provision in the classroom and SEN support.

Ordinarily available provision refers to the support that every school and college provides to help all children and young people learn. This should include high-quality, inclusive teaching, ensuring every child feels welcome and can succeed, no matter their background or abilities. Schools and colleges provide a wide range of support to help all children and young people succeed. At Henry Cort, we aim to support all children through our 'adaptive teaching' approach.
