### **Geography Field Trip**

At the beginning of the school term Ms Gudgeon took our Year 11 Geography students to visit Southsea, allowing them to collect relevant research data to successfully complete their fieldwork.

Students conducted a range of primary data collection including sediment studies, bipolar surveys, land use surveys and questionnaires. The results were processed and analysed in class in readiness for their paper 3 exam.



### **Dracula Trip**

On October 24, Miss Wallis took our Year 10 and 11 GCSE Drama students to watch Dracula at the Haymarket in Basingstoke. This was preparation for their GCSE written exam. The performance was an adaptation of Bram Stoker's 1897 gothic novel by the world renowned 'Black Eyed Theatre Company'. Using a range of Brechtian techniques, the company brought the traditional novel to life with a contemporary twist. This is the first time some students have seen a theatrical play and this experience will have a positive impact on their drama work moving forward. Everyone had a great time and we're looking forward to seeing a wider range of plays in the future to expand our knowledge of modern theatre.
